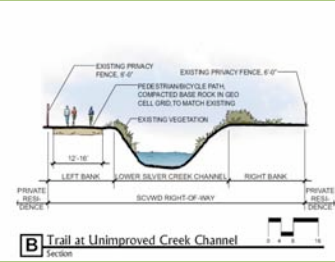

Lower Silver Creek Trail

Project Description

The City of San José is preparing a master plan to guide future development of a six-mile trail system to connect Lake Cunningham to the Coyote Creek Trail.



Location: The trail uses portions of the creek and a PG&E Utility easement. Generally, the trail will follow the creek from Coyote Creek to Jackson Avenue. At the recently

completed Dobern Avenue Bridge, the trail will follow the utility alignment to Lake Cunningham.

Benefits: The trail will travel through several neighborhoods, including, East Valley/680 Communities, Mayfair, Five Wounds / Brookwood Terrace, and Thirteenth Street. The trail will provide residents a place for recreational activity and relaxation.

Total Budget: The Master Plan is funded through local (Council District 5 C&C) and grant (Santa Clara County Open Space Authority) funds. The cost of the Master Plan is \$489,000. (Additional funds will be required to build the entire project.)

Features: The trail will be similar to other trails in the City's network, and include a paved sur-

face, seating areas, informational signage and landscaping along selected areas.

Schedule: The Master Plan will be completed by December 2007. Several features of the project have been installed, including Dobern Avenue Pedestrian Bridge, Kammerer Avenue Pedestrian Bridge, Plata Arroyo Pedestrian Bridge, Lausset Avenue Pedestrian Bridge, and the Wenlock Drive Pedestrian Corridor.
