Capital Action Plan - Proposed list of projects to be completed.

Infrastructure Backlog - The long list of parks and recreation facilities that need renovation because they have suffered from lack of maintenance or have simply worn out from many years of use

Parks Bond (Measure P) - In November of 2000, voters approved \$228 million in General Obligation Bonds (Measure P - San José Safe Neighborhood Parks and Recreation Bond Projects) to complete improvements at neighborhood parks (i.e. safety upgrades to 90 playlots and restroom renovations at 28 parks), 7 regional parks, construction of 9 community centers, 2 sports complexes and development of 5 trail segments

San José Green Vision - On October 30, 2007, the San José City Council adopted the Green Vision, a fifteen-year plan to transform San José into a world center of Clean Technology innovation, promote cutting-edge sustainable practices, and demonstrate that the goals of economic growth, environmental stewardship and fiscal responsibility are inextricably linked. The Ideal Planning Area Model - To have a balanced recreational system, the model calls for a dog park, a skatepark, community garden, two "High Use" sports fields, aquatic facility and access to a community center with a gym.

Underserved Areas - Neighborhoods within the City that have no access to current or future proposed parkland, trails or recreation school lands within a 1/3 of a mile radius of residences without encountering a major barrier.
